

## easy ways to put it all on one page

With careful positioning of text and images and clever folding, you can have a one-sheet program with a built-in cover. These examples can be made on letter or tabloid paper at a copy shop or on a laser printer using scanned art. We folded the bicycle program three times and wrapped with a personalized band. The seaweed program employs an asymmetrical accordion fold. For the scroll, we relied on calligraphy by Michael Sull, but you could use a script font. Position names along the edge of the back before rolling and tying.
